

Miscellaneous Updates:

TOMEC: Salem UCC continues to be an active participant in the various programs sponsored by the Top Of The Mountain Ecumenical Council (TOMEC). If you wish to donate to the TOMEC Food Pantry, please make your checks payable to Salem UCC and mark the memo line "Missions - TOMEC Food Pantry". Cash donations should be placed in a separate envelope marked "Missions - TOMEC Food Pantry so as not to get the donation mixed in with our regular collection. Non-perishable food and cleaning supplies should be placed on the stage in Fellowship Hall. Always needed in addition to food: pet food, Ensure, diapers, wipes, shampoo, deodorant, tooth brushes, tooth paste, feminine monthly care products and laundry detergent. Due to reduced funding by the State, the Food Pantry is in need of funds to meet the increased number of people they serve. Presently, they serve 266 families consisting of 848 people.

Lenten Discussion Series: Mike Lonergan recently conducted a discussion series that reviewed a book by Alan Hamilton titled "24 Hours That Changed The World", which chronicles the last 24 hours of the life of Christ and the impact of His crucifixion. Currently, he is conducting a review of a book by Mike Slaughter titled "Change The World." Both programs were well received, and Mike is planning to conduct additional programs in the future, so stay tuned.

Demographic Analysis: Recently, Dr. Menking conducted a discussion regarding a demographic analysis that he completed for Salem, so that we will have a better understanding of the church's local service area. Copies of his detailed demographic analysis are available on the information table in Fellowship Hall. This information will be very helpful as the church evaluates how to position itself for the future.

Backpack Program: The backpack program continues to provide needed support of supplies and food to 52 children who are students at the local Tobyhanna Elementary School.

Memorial Garden: Don't forget to consider ordering an engraved brick that can be placed in the Salem Reflection & Memorial Garden to honor a loved one or a special event. Order forms are available in Fellowship Hall. Completed forms should be returned to Don Jones for processing.

New backrests available: The church now has six (6) new backrests that are available for those who may be experiencing discomfort or having some trouble with their backs while using the pews during the Sunday service. Please notify one of the ushers if you would like to use a backrest.
